Staff Report:

Hannah Lawrence addressed the Board.

- April Gatehouse hours, open 9 am to 3 pm daily.
- Off Road Vehicle hours of operation, 8 am to 4 pm. Will switch to summer hours May 1st.
- No campfires allowed for the month of April.
- There are many plovers on the beach. Speed limit is 5 mph.
- Looking to hire for maintenance position. Hiring in process for seasonal positions.
- Several group projects have taken place. Upper Cape Tech helped install the plover fencing.
 Massachusetts Beach Buggy Association, (MBBA), beach cleanup was held Saturday. Along with
 some Sandy Neck Board members, pallets were installed on the Habitat Conservation Plan, (HCP)
 area. Snow fencing was installed in the upper parking lot. A big thank you to all who helped. *See
 attached pictures.
- The front dune restoration took place and was finished prior to April 1st. *See attached picture.
- Tom said it looked like we need more pallets. Hannah replied that MBBA is working to get more. There are several sources helping us get more pallets.
- Gordon Starr asked Hannah if the pathways down to the beach in the lower parking lot were open. Hannah replied that they were. The Mobi mats will be installed as we get closer to the season.

Old Business: In person versus remote. A discussion regarding the pros and cons took place. On a motion by Tom O'Neill to start in person Board meetings in May 2022. The motion was seconded by Ann Canedy. Voice vote: Ann Canedy, yes; Bill Carey, yes; Bill Monroe, yes; Maureen Piccione. yes; Pete Sampou, yes; Tom O'Neill, yes. Motion passed.

- 1. Conservation and beach erosion along our coastlines. Tom O'Neill addressed the Board. He wanted the Board to keep thinking about the three strategic focus areas. Looking out into the future regarding these issues. Tom is looking forward to having in person meeting and inviting people to come and speak to the Board regarding areas of concern. Pete spoke about the plans to move the parking lot back and move the Gatehouse due to Sea level rising. Donna stated that everything is in place and we are on target. Mentioned that for safety there have been pedestrian bumps installed at the Gatehouse. Ann spoke about the Army Corps of Engineers plans to armor berms. A discussion followed. Gordon Starr addressed the Board. He asked if our Board had ever had Greg Berman from the County Extension Service speak to the Board. Tom said no. Greg is a Geologist who has studied the shoreline of Cape Cod who could talk about sand movement and the dynamics of sand at Sandy Neck. Sandy Neck is not going to breach. He could come and speak to the Board regarding these matters.


Matters not Reasonably Anticipated by the Chair: None.
