Shellfish Committee Minutes of the Meeting DATE: February 10, 2021
TIME: 6:00 P.M. to 7:04 P.M.

This meeting was held via ZOOM Physically closed to the public to avoid group congregation.

Stuart Rapp chaired the February 10, 2021 meeting of the Shellfish Committee. Stuart Rapp took a roll call of members present at the meeting. Stuart Rapp read a notice at the beginning of the meeting:

NOTICE OF RECORDING "Please note that tonight's meeting is recorded and broadcast on Channel 18 and, in accordance with MGL Chapter 30A, s. 20, I must inquire whether anyone is taping this meeting and to please make their presence known."

- 1. **Meeting Minutes:** The Shellfish Committee unanimously approved a motion made by Robert Lancaster and seconded by William Shumway to approve the January 13, 2021 minutes as presented.
- 2. Chairman's Comments: Chair Stuart Rapp asked that the Minutes from November 18, 2020 Shellfish Committee Meeting be amended. The amendment is: Councilor Jessica Rapp Grassetti and the Cotuit Civic Association stated that they both have been well informed of the project proposed for 33 Oyster Place, Cotuit neither expressed an opinion in favor or against the project.

Stuart Rapp has a time conflict and will leave the meeting at 7:00 pm and designate another Committee Member as Chair if necessary, for the remainder of the meeting.

### 3. Natural Resources Report:

Officer Croteau presented the Natural Resources Report. The following represents sales for shellfish permits to date compared to 2020.

Marstons Mills River and Prince Cove will open February 15<sup>th</sup> through April 1<sup>st</sup>, this is a DMF closure and opening.

• Shellfish Maps for Area Openings/Closures (SC:23.1, SC:27.5-new)

Officer Croteau explained that in accordance by creating a sub areas of SC:27 the whole area was saved from being reclassified. Below is an excerpt from a letter addressed to the Town Manager, Mark Ells from the Division of Marine Fisheries dated February 4, 2021. A copy of the letter in its entirety, and Map of Area are attached.

Chapter 130, Section 74A of the Massachusetts General Laws, the Division of Marine Fisheries has determined that a portion of Hyannis Outer Harbor (SC:27), in the Town of Barnstable, no longer meets the criterial for a classification of "APPROVED" based on the NSSP Mooring Area Criteria. Therefore, the below defined classification area, SC:27.5- Hyannis Outer Harbor Mooring Area, has been reclassified to "CONDITIONALLY APPROVED". This reclassification shall be effective as of sunrise on February 5, 2021. This classification area's status will change seasonally to "CLOSED TO SHELLFISH" during the boating season. As a result, the status of this newly reclassified area will remain "OPEN TO SHELLFISHING" until May 1, 2021.

The below defined area may remain open to the harvest of shellfish for direct human consumption subject to local rules and regulations under authority of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 130, Section.

### SC:27.5 Hyannis Outer Harbor Mooring Area is defined as:

"The waters, flats and all tributaries of Hyannis Harbor, westerly of a line drawn from the Hyannis Harbor light at the eastern end of the Hyannis Harbor breakwater to the southern end of the Stewart Creek breakwater."

### 4. Status of pending NOI pier applications before the Conservation Commission:

Applicant: Robert J. and Rita M. Davis

Project Location: 986 Sea View Avenue, Osterville, MA 02655

Representative: John O'Dea, Sullivan Engineering and Consulting, Inc.

Proposed Project: Modify existing pier in West Bay Conservation Hearing Date: 02/09/2021 4:30PM via Zoom

Modification of the pier is in elevation. The pier will allow 5 feet of clearance from ground (currently 3 feet) to allow public access under the pier. No Comment from Committee, no vote taken.

#### 5. New Business:

- A. Proposed regulation changes pertaining to commercial catch reports: §407-12-D(4) and §407-13-A(3). Proposed regulation changes pertaining to transfer of recreational permits and recreational permit suspensions: §1-5 and §407-71.

Officer Croteau started the discussion on regulation changes and possibly eliminating the requirement for Commercial Shellfishmen to submit the Town of Barnstable Catch Report. Currently the Commonwealth requires reports be filed electronically through Standard Atlantic Fisheries Information System (SAFIS) electronically. Natural Resources rely on SAFIS for this data.

This topic will be referred to the Shellfish Working Group for further discussion.

- 2. Pertaining to Recreational Transfer of License: §1-5 & §407-71
  - §1-5 Proposed increase in fine from \$15 to \$75
  - §407-71 Revocation or suspension of Town permit.

Officer Croteau started the discussion with the following proposed amendment.

Amend the regulation by adding the wording highlighted in **bold** 

The Town of Barnstable shellfish permit, recreational or commercial, may be revoked or suspended by the Town Manager for any violation of the Town shellfish regulations. A hearing with the Town Manager will be afforded on revocations. Recreational shellfish permits may also be suspended by the Director of Natural Resources at the request of the Shellfish Constable or a Natural Resource Officer for non-compliance with shellfish regulations. Any person who is issued a suspension will be provided the opportunity for a hearing with the Director of the Marine and Environmental Affairs Department. Any person desiring such a hearing must submit a written request for said hearing postmarked within five business days of the effective date of suspension. An appeal of the Director of the Marine Environmental Affairs Department's decision may be filed with the Office of the Town Manager within five days of issuance of said decision.

This topic will be on next month's Agenda and possibly be voted on.

B. Sand Point revetment drone footage: Ben Sacco, Shellfish Technician. Ben Sacco presented the photos recorded at 81 and 86 Sand Point, Osterville. This footage was recorded to monitor the condition of the Town's shellfish nets. The effects of this re-construction of the revetment resulted in an abundance of silting in the shellfish nets. There is also a significant change along the shoreline in this area and steamer habitat was lost in this area due to this project. Conservation was made aware of this development; however, this project did not violate any ordinances. Counselor Clark recommended that Chairman, Stuart Rapp discuss this project and the outcome with Conservation and perhaps Town Council. Chair Rapp requested Ben Sacco to attend meeting with him to present these findings.

#### 6. Old Business:

A. Marstons Mills River Dry Dredging Pilot, final narrative.

Officer Croteau presented the following:

## **Quahog Dry Dragging – Marstons Mills River**

- Short window of opportunity prior to spring spawn
- Continued assessment of dry dragging on different types of bottom
- Could be conducive to seed recruitment
- Allows pilot removal of nuisance sponges
- Could be done annually for three years
- Could be cut after one year if seed is recruited and present
- Require surveys of the bottom before and after
- Scope of area allowed to be dragged.? Do not want to displace soft shell calm pumping or damage any sub tidal lines of soft shell clams

#### PILOT CONDITIONS:

- 1. Dragging the flats extending from 500 Baxters Neck Road through 516 Baxters Neck Road is prohibited.
- 2. High grading: preferentially selecting littlenecks over top-necks, cherrystones and chowders in a given tow is prohibited.
- 3. Dragging between ½ hour before sunset and 7:30am the following morning is prohibited.

\*Violations pertaining to these conditions will result in loss of privilege to continue participating in the pilot.

Officer Croteau mentioned reaching out to the Transfer Station for a possible location to store the sponges. The Town is working on assisting with the disposal of removed sponge. Still ongoing.

#### 7. Special Presentations:

A. Review of Potential Shellfish Habitat Improvement Methods (Sub-Committee: Paul Caruso, Al Suprenant, Jake Angelo)

Paul Caruso presented on some of the topics that are being pursued which include: boating issues, docks and piers, dredging, sea lettuce removal and cultured shellfish or filtering. There will be more discussion at the next meeting and the documents presented will be email out to Committee Members.








## Locus Plan
