The HyArts Discovery Walk has an opening for an outdoor art piece.

The Mid-Cape Cultural Council (MCCC), in cooperation with the Town of Barnstable (TOB), is working on a project to create the HyArts Discovery Walk, a series of interactive outdoor sculptures near and on the Hyannis waterfront. The Walk is intended to reflect the natural beauty of Hyannis Harbor and improve visitors' and residents' enjoyment of the harbor and downtown area, which comprise the Hyannis Arts District. The Walk activates the existing Walkway to the Sea with new outdoor sculptures designed to be interactive and educational. The experience begins at Main Street on the beautiful village green then follows the wave-patterned brick path to Aselton Park and the waterfront, connecting the historic downtown area to the bustling waterfront with an opportunity to engage the senses.

Two sculptures are in progress; we are seeking a third to round out the walk.

If Selected:

Artists may be asked to participate in making presentations. The Town may use the designs to promote the project. The MCCC has raised funds to cover artist fees, fabrication and installation of the artwork (approx. \$2500-\$5000 per installation). MCCC reserves the right to negotiate with selected artist to adjust the original design proposal as necessary due to funding, engineering and safety requirements, concerns about the environmental or historic characteristics of the site, or other unforeseen issues that may affect implementation of the designs. The completed artworks will become the property of MCCC/TOB. MCCC/TOB may reproduce images of the artworks only for promotional or interpretive use. Copyright remains with the artist. **We must complete installation of the artworks in by fall 2019 for year-round, permanent exhibit.**

Timeline:

- September 30, 2018: Proposal Submission Deadline
- October 2018 Mid Cap Cultural Council review of submissions and selection
- November 2018 January 2019: Selected artist develops design concept and reviews with MCCC Project Manager and Town Engineer
- February 2019: Project schedule established upon engineer report sign off from MCCC and TOB
- February/March 2019: MCCC/TOB works with artists for fabrication and installation of artwork
- Spring 2019 installation preferred but flexible; Installation MUST be complete by end of November 2019

Guidelines for Submissions

Deadline to apply: September 30, 2018

Who may apply: All artists over 18-years-old, working in any medium-are eligible to apply. Artists may collaborate with each other or with artists in other disciplines and apply as a design team. Artists that live and work on Cape Cod, year-round or seasonally, will have priority.
